The programme, subject to contingencies on the day, provides for a low altitude flypast at 3.15pm by the Lancaster bomber, a Spitfire fighter and a Hurricane. These same aircraft will earlier in the day have participated in the fly-past over HM The Queen at Buckingham Palace. This is a tremendous honour for Watermead. The aircraft will of course be flying low over Aylesbury on the approach and this is an honour which we should be very happy to share with Aylesbury and surrounding villages, many of which will have a good view of the aircraft as they fly over.

The RAF obviously cannot guarantee any flypast by the BBMF. In particular good met. conditions on the day will be vital. These aircraft are a priceless and unique national asset, maintained with great dedication at RAF Coningsby. Obviously one cannot just ring up British Aerospace and ask for spares for a 50 year old Lancaster! The Merlin engine is no longer in the Rolls-Royce catalogue, either.

Detailed planning work is now going ahead in consultation with the RAF, who have supplied a detailed briefing - even a short flypast involves a great deal of preparatory work including negotiation with Air Traffic Control. Safety is of paramount importance and strict crowd control will need to be enforced.

Residents planning a quiet nap on VE Day afternoon will be well advised to wait until after 3 o'clock! The aircraft may be between 50 and 55 years old and the technology outdated, but these are aeroplanes with serious horsepower. A Lancaster is not a Tiger Moth (we occasionally see Tigers over Watermead) - the BBMF's Lanc, PA474, is a late mark and her awesome 108,000 cc of internal combustion engine pack a combined horsepower of around 7,000. They should make a lovely noise.

In tribute to the young men who flew the Lancaster into action and who made such a major contribution to the great victory there will be a collection on the day for the Bomber Command Association.

COMPLETION!

Lakeside Land Limited have completed on the purchase of the nightclub land, the lower lake and the amenity land on Watermead. Completion was on 15th March, just inside the deadline imposed by the receivers, made possible at the end of the day by directors loans to the company.

The total price including a contribution to the receivers' legal costs was £26,250, to which must be added Lakeside's own costs of setting up, administration, surveyors and legal fees. A higher bid was put in before exchange of contracts, but Lakeside's offer price was protected by the binding option agreed by the receivers. A major role in securing the deal was played by Lloyd's Bank, who showed enlightened commercial self-interest in agreeing the deal. Lakeside had appealed to the bank at Board level. No fresh planning application has been put in by the developer, but Residents Association chairman Michael Shrimpton has not ruled one out. A major problem for the developer is lack of space for adequate car-parking. The future will depend on the support the company receives from the community - unfortunately the company has been hit by resignations from the Board at a crucial time. Fresh blood is urgently needed. The Board is to consider calling an extraordinary general meeting of the company at its next meeting and the Board may need to be restructured. Volunteers with appropriate experience should speak to Michael Shrimpton or one of the other directors.

The Board has received a number of representations from residents living on the lower lake re the behaviour of those fishing, particularly the younger element. Restriction of fishing is a major issue for a number of shareholders and major changes are in prospect.

The deal includes the balance of the 125 year lease on the village hall, on generous terms as regards repairs. The Residents Association committee and Lakeside Land will probably meet to discuss the management of the hall after the new committee is elected at the WVRA AGM on April 27th. The future is potentially very exciting, but everything depends on the continued support of the community.

New Bus Service

Pressure from your long-suffering committee, has persuaded the powers that be to lay on an extra morning bus to the town centre. The service runs daily at 9.24am from Watermead to Aylesbury.

byiously completion on the sale of the nightclub land has come as a great relief. We are now finally in a position to close down the Fighting Fund, which has been in abeyance since the Lakeside Land deal was struck. Watermead is now more of a community than it has ever been, with its future looking more secure than for some time.

We need however to build on what has been done and to do that we need to see fresh faces both on the Residents Committee and on the Board of Lakeside Land Limited.

Hard Work!

The past year has been hard work and not surprisingly many of the present Committee will be standing down at the AGM on April 27th. Please do come and put your name forward for election.

This AGM will be an important

meeting. If it is poorly attended I think residents should expect a low level of committee activity over the forthcoming months.

All-in-all it has been an eventful and exciting year for the committee and the residents of Watermead and, with your help, it will prove to be just as exciting in years to come. So let's see you all at the AGM and the VE Day celebrations.
