### Watermead Remembers...

s the nights draw in what better day to recall for this Autumn issue than the VE Day commemoration on Monday 8th May 1995?

Some on the estate said it couldn't be done, that VE Day held no claim on the hearts of the younger generation who make up most of the village's population. Well the Watermead Village Residents Association went ahead. The community responded in a way it has never done before and people came from miles around to join us. Estimates of the crowd varied from 2,000 to 3,000.

Over £600 was raised for the Bomber Command Association, leading to a warm letter of thanks from Marshal of the Royal Air Force Sir Michael Beetham, President of the Association. The day was made by the presence of veterans of the Command, brave men and women who had fought for the freedom we enjoy

today. They were greatly moved by the unforgettable sight and sound of the Lancaster and by the response of the crowd.

Michael Shrimpton, Chairman of Residents, was subsequently honoured with Honorary

Membership of Thames Valley
Bomber Command Association.

The day was rounded off with a short but moving sunset

#### Chairman's Brief

Hello again everybody. Welcome back to the View and many thanks to the new editor, Stuart Mackay and those nice people at Aitch Em who have worked so hard to get this issue out. We badly need

volunteers for the next, Christmas issue, especially those with graphics/computing skills. Please don't feel shy about coming forward - it would be a shame to see publication suspended again.

As you may know the last issue of the View was held up and the AGM notices with it. The AGM was a non-event and we have had to rebuild since then, with an enthusiatic new committee.

Grateful thanks to the many residents who came up to thank the committee on and after VE Day. Denis Pannett's wonderful painting has now been completed and Graham Severn will be auctionning it on 12th December at Ski and Sail - even if you don't intend to bid it promises to be an exciting event and signed prints will be on sale, at £29.50. It was always intended that Lakeside Land would trade to raise the funds for maintenance and the company has made a big commitment with the prints, its first trading venture. It deserves your support. The money raised will go equally to maintain the land and to Bomber Command Association. Each of the 500 numbered prints, on fine quality art paper, will be signed by the artist and the plates will then be destroyed.

Lakeside's first AGM will be on the 13th December, the day after the auction. It would be nice to see all the shareholders there - the Board have worked extremely hard over the past year, putting in hundreds of hours on your behalf without thought of reward. (Board meetings have sometimes not broken up until early in the morning). The failure of the final share issue was of course a blow but Lakeside has pulled through. The company's achievement in taking on an opponent with fifty times its resources has been immense.

The grass maintenance contract has now been awarded (thanks to Watermead Companies, who have been generous in the handover period) and a £3,000+ investment programme for the village hall approved.

Thanks to Sue Snell for her excellent management of the hall for both WVRA and Lakeside and all the best with the new baby! Dorothy Toler (432405) has ably taken over the reigns.

Some of you may have seen the story in the Bucks Herald concerning the cricket pavilion. WVRA have now taken up this issue with the Chief Executive of AVDC. Personally I think the way the cricket club have been kept out of a cricket pavilion which was originally intended to be a community asset is scandalous. The battle with the commercial operator of the pavilion (who took it over subject to an express planning condition permitting use by cricketers at weekends) will continue.

One downside to suspending publication until a new editor came forward was that we could not keep you up to date with significant planning developments. The Planning Group, of planning professionals living on the estate, has started to swing into action and they have provided a valuable input. We are supporting the garden centre (opposite the Holiday Inn) and the ground floor restaurant at Ski and Sail, in each case subject to suitable safeguards against misuse as a nightclub and provision for the extra traffic. We have repeated our long-held concern about the capacity and safety of the spine road and made it clear that we would strongly oppose any second entrance onto the estate. My own view is that the spine road needs parking restrictions between both roundabouts and highly visible 30 mph speed signs. Traffic calming measures are another option but have met with the opposition of county highway engineers.

All these issues have of course been discussed in committee and the minutes are posted each month in the notice board (in the wind tunnel leading to the piazza), so that you can know what's going on. See you on Bonfire Night, at the auction, the AGM and the carol concert!

#### PAVILION CRISIS:

B Y M I C H A E L S H R I M P T O N

The pavilion issue continues to dominate cricket life on Watermead. AVDC planning committee rubber-stamped an officers report advising against enforcement procedures against Nurserytyme, who bought the pavilion (we believe at a discount) subject to a planning condition permitting use by cricketers at weekends. WVCC have never obtained access to the pavilion, whether at the weekend or any other time. An undertaking by the chief planning officer to disclose the report in advance to WVRA Chairman and WVCC trustee Michael Shrimpton was not honoured. Michael Shrimpton has advised the Club Chairman of his view that the planning committee's decision was illegal, null and void and that the

officer's report contained legal flaws. A meeting between Michael Shrimpton, the Club Chairman Jean-Paul Arama, the chief planning officer and an AVDC solicitor failed to produce a solution to the crisis.

Not only has the pavilion operator denied access to the Watermead's own cricket club, he has objected to the use of the pavilion water supply to water the pitch, with the result that the pitch development has been held back. For a second season in a row the First XI has had to play its matches away from Watermead (at Whitchurch) a great shame since the First XI was promoted to the First Division of the Midweek League for the 95 season.

The Cricket Club Committee continues to investigate the possibility of a second pavilion. The land is available and AVDC could hardly refuse planning permission given its mishandling of the issue to date. Even a single story pavilion however will cost around £75,000 and the money isn't there.

There will be a full cricket report in the next issue of Village View. I am sure the club would welcome new blood for '96. I expect winter nets will start in Jan/Feb. I wouldn't worry about your playing skills, as the 2nd XI plays at a friendly level and you can develop your skills at the nets. No doubt there is room in the 1st XI for good players.
