Auction Countdown Ski & Sail on December 12th...

Starts at 7pm, viewing from 2pm

On Tuesday 28th November 1995 Michael Shrimpton flew to RAF Coningsby in Lincolnshire to present the first print of Watermead Remembers to the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight. The aircraft was crewed by Watermead resident and ex V-bomber pilot Ted Tootell and son Steve, a British Airways 737 Captain. The original plan called for them to use Ted's beautiful 1946-vintage Auster AOMk6 single engined light aircraft, much of it restored by Ted himself. Bad weather forced a hurried change to a modern twin-engined Aztec, fully equipped for blind flying, which Lakeside Director Philip Toler (there to see them off, thanks Philip) saw disappear into the murk soon after take-off! The Watermead team were delighted to find themselves behind a Tornado in the Coningsby circuit and were treated as honoured guests at BBMF Headquarters. Ted was surprised to spot a calendar on sale in the BBMF museum picturing him flying a Vulcan V-Bomber over Niagara Falls thirty years ago (they now have a copy signed by the pilot!). The original of this impressive photograph is on Watermead by the way.


Auction will be of original, plus prints numbered 2-10 (no 1 has been presented to the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight)

Airfix kits of the Lancaster, Spitfire and Hurricane aircraft will also be on sale, priced from £2.99, along with aircraft such as the Blenheim, Wellington and Mosquito which served with Bomber Command and which were flown by the aircrew there on the night.

Chairman's Brief

I have never felt such pride in this community as I did on VE Day afternoon and the highlight of that great day was surely the magnificent flypast by the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight. Who can

forget the sight and sound of fifty year old aircraft roaring in low level formation over the Piazza and Lake? I still remember the looks I received back in mid-1994 when I said that I would like an RAF flypast for VE Day and a Lancaster would be nice!

I have spoken with both the pilot and navigator of that historic aircraft, so symbolic of the hopes of our nation in its gravest hour of crisis, and thanked them on behalf of you all. It was a great privilege to be able to fly to RAF Coningsby and see at first hand the superb operation of the BBMF. The OC, Sdn Ldr Groombridge, was pleased to receive the first signed copy of Denis Pannett's painting and expressed great interest in our plans for the auction on December 12th.

I hope to see you there in great numbers. As well as a further opportunity to repay part of a debt which can

never be repaid to the Royal Air Force and Bomber Command in particular this is Lakeside Land's firsttrading venture. As you know it was always intended that the company would trade, so that the amenity land can be maintained. I can assure you that there will be plenty of opportunities for the young company to invest in this community in the years to come. The village hall, starved of investment since it was built, is but one example. A children's playground, in my view a priority, is another.

I also hope to see most of you at the carol concert, which I am sure will become the traditional way for us to end the community year.

Looking ahead to 1996 we need to work out the relationship between WVRA and Lakeside, so that the two work together for the benefit of the village. I should like to hear your thoughts. One option is that publication of the View could be transferred to the company with a proper Editorial Board and regular publication dates, making financial administration easier. Is there a need for both organisations? How do we resolve the problem, apparent for several years, of a low level of active community involvement in WVRA, which tends to negate the advantage that every resident is a member of WVRA for free?

Watermead Remembers...

On Tuesday 12th December, at Ski and Sail, starting at 7pm, with viewing from 2pm, Graham Severn will auction Denis Pannett's beautiful painting of the flypast Watermead Remembers, in the artist's presence. Ricky Dyson GM, 'Tiny' Cooling, Harry Le Marchant and Harry Purver, each of them veterans of Bomber Command who were with us on VE-Day, have signed the limited edition prints and will be there, along with highly decorated French Resistance heroine Marie-France MacCarthy, holder of the Croix de Guerre, who helped many of our airmen escape back to England. Prints numbered 2 to 10 have been signed by a Marshal of the Royal Air Force and will be auctioned after the painting. The prints are limited edition and the plates will be destroyed.

VE Day can never be commemorated in the same way again and this is a permanent record of a special event in the life of the nation and of our own community. The painting captures the spirit and high emotion of the flypast and the

prints would make an ideal Christmas present, showing our community at its best. There are four framing options and a discount bespoke framing service is available. You may reserve a copy with the order form inside.

Ricky Dyson, who won the George Medal in 1944 for getting his badly injured skipper out of a blazing Lancaster which crashed shortly after takeoff is featured in the new book *Looking Into* Hell, by Mel Rolfe. By arrangement with Cassell Ltd Lakeside Land will be offering copies of the book, autographed by Ricky, for sale at £16.99. Wellington pilot 'Tiny' Cooling is also featured in this month's Wingspan magazine and copies will be on sale at £2.20. With Christmas coming up Lakeside have arranged with the manufacturers to sell a range of Airfix aircraft kits, all on a VE Day theme. In no case will Lakeside Land market merchandise at a price above recommended retail. Major credit cards and Diners chargecard are accepted and all proceeds will be shared with Bomber Command Association.

Bonfire Night

This years bonfire night was the biggest yet on Watermead. A new feature of the arrangements was that the organisers did not dive into the lake and the 1995 event is unlikely to repeat the success (!) of 1993s in getting onto Beadles About. The fireworks were paid for entirely by the Watermead Inn, who worked closely with the Residents Association and the Police in order to try and minimise disruption to residents and maintain emergency access. Despite a record crowd of 6,000 and heavy traffic serious disruption was avoided. Many thanks to the Watermead Inn, the Police, St. John Ambulance, those residents who volunteered to steward the event, Bucks County Council Highways and James Campion, a resident from Whinchat, who supplied van (and labour) free of charge. Next years event has been set provisionally for Saturday November 2nd. Lakeside's land will again be used and joint planning will start in January. The night provided conclusive evidence of the importance of good stewarding and more comprehensive stewarding will be high on the agenda for 1996.
