## Watermead Firework Spectacular Has Rave Review In Local Paper

Watermead's Charity Fireworks Night got off to a splendid start, with the arrival of the Vice-Lieutenant John Paterson OBE KSt.J JP in Michael Underwood's magnificent 1939 Rolls-Royce Wraith, preceded by a police motorcycle outrider.

The fireworks were the best ever on Watermead, with a spectacular second display that beat everybody else's onto the *Herald's* colour page.

The Band of the Royal Air Force Regiment added a dash of colour and turned in a highly professional and musical performance, putting Watermead's Bandstand to the purpose it was designed for. Around £500 was raised for Service Charities who were there in force, including our friends from Bomber Command Association.

First and foremost a thank you to those few who helped out on Fireworks Night. I would particularly like to mention James Campion who is no longer even a resident of Watermead yet made his van available for two out- of-town journeys to collect and return the vital traffic cones. We will now set up a stewards register, so that we will know in advance if we need more paid security officers.

The event was soured however by several controversial decisions by Aylesbury Police and atrocious weather - the promised clearing did not take place until the start of the second display, by which time many of the estimated 3-4,000 crowd had left. A desperate shortage of volunteers for stewarding and programme selling also caused huge problems for the organising company Lakeside Land and contributed to heavy financial losses. The car parks were late in opening and over 2,000 programmes

went unsold. Some people actually appear to have left thinking the small first display was all there was to see, although had they bought a programme they would have seen that the first display was just to provide an interval for the Band (a continuous performance outdoors isn't sensible in November weather).

Aylesbury Police interfered with an agreement with Aylesbury Football Club whereby they would charge for the use of their car park by those coming to the fireworks. They were late in attending, charged Lakeside Land for the use of our community constable and failed to do enough to direct traffic into the car-parks. The officers who did attend made little effort to co-ordinate with Lakeside Land and walked off without telling the co-ordinator Michael Shrimpton. There was then an affray in the Piazza involving as many as 20 drunken male youths, following a 'glassing' incident. Chief Steward Gary Poole was assaulted and criminal charges are pending against his assailant - but for Gary's efforts and the efforts of the small team of stewards and professional security officers the incident might have been much worse. disorder had largely been brought under control by the time the police (not those who had policed the event earlier) arrived. Concerns by the Lakeside Board over discipline and efficiency in Aylesbury Police are to be drawn to the attention of Superintendent Friday, senior officer at Aylesbury. The event has soured police/community relations yet again, which had barely recovered from the events of April.

The unhelpful attitude of Aylesbury Police was in stark contrast to the high degree of professionalism and willingness to work with the community shown by Thames Valley Protection Officers based at the Force HQ in Kidlington (who arranged for police divers to search the lake near the Bandstand), Thames Valley Traffic Officers (who arranged the police escort) and the Royal Air Force Police, who outnumbered Aylesbury Police. Magnificent co-operation was again extended by the St. John

Ambulance, who unlike the police stayed on the scene and so were able to attend to those injured in the affray.

The heavy financial loss has caused the Lakeside Board to abandon large events until further notice. A possible summer charity event to raise money for animal charities will not now go ahead and the Board has imposed strict sponsorship conditions for the 1997 Fireworks Night, which if it goes ahead will be on Saturday 1st November 1997.

Please support the Carol Concert on Saturday 21st at 6 pm and be there in good time - it's too cold to delay the start as last year while people arrive, particularly for families. Support for events has always been a problem and a poor turnout is immensely discouraging. If you have an idea for an event please put it to me or the Watermead Community Forum but for large events you will need to suggest ways of raising £2,000 +

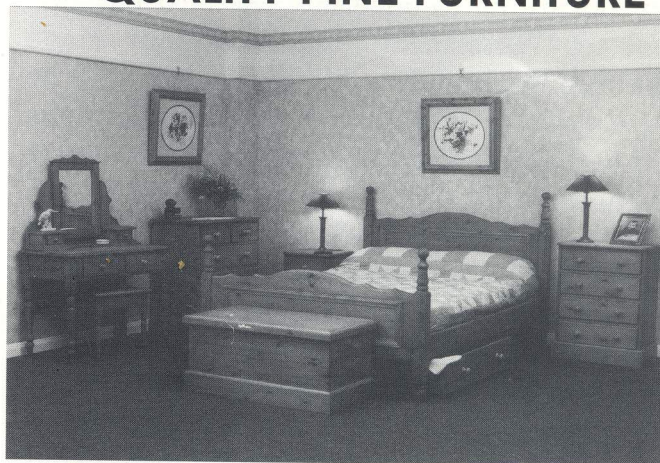

for policing (which we pay for - it isn't cheap) and security. Aylesbury Police also make life difficult for event organisers (I don't think Lakeside Land is unique in that). Voluntary stewarding has now failed three times in succession (VE Day, Fireworks 95 & 96). This means having to budget for professional security, which in reality means large events will now be few and far between. I regret this, particularly as small events (aimed at Watermead only) usually fail for lack of support - I am only too well aware of the vicious cycle which sees people get interested in running events, only to see them fail, following which they understandably give up.

I am pleased at the two new Board appointments - Michael Long and Richard Crake, both experienced businessmen. There seem to be very few experienced business or professional women willing to get involved and with Annabel Edward's resignation due to changed business commitments following the Forte take-over we now have no women

on the Board. One area where we are weak is public relations - publicity for the Fireworks was almost non-existent and we found both Mix 96 and the *Herald* titles giving priority to their own sponsored events, hardly the way to attract advertising revenue from Watermead's businesses. The problem, aggravated by the failure of the posters (which Scottish and Newcastle had agreed to organise) was identified weeks in advance but we had no spare Board manpower to correct it - we were fully stretched just organising the event. No-one has yet come forward to act as database manager - we desperately need someone with Mac skills (your Chairman is a PC type, as are all the Board but our fairly sophisticated database is Mac - we're relying on printouts and we can't update it, which is hopeless). LCAM also needs a Minute Secretary - LCAM has had a troubled beginning and without a Minute Secretary its Board can't function as it should. I shall be devoting more time to LCAM over the

next year, assuming we don't have more crises.

We have had virtually no response to the planning application on the 8 acres - no shareholder has put in on the agenda for the Lakeside AGM for example. I assume therefore that we are on the right lines and I am continuing to negotiate the best possible deal for Watermead. One comment made was that a children's playground should be given priority over sporting facilities but the two can be planned together and the Board has now set up a Playground Working Group to identify sites, consult with residents and planners and produce workable solutions. The problem with a playground has always been running costs (principally liability insurance) rather than capital but we may be able to get around that in partnership with the local authority. I should stress that the new pavilion is seen as an all year round sporting facility - I would like to see youth football in the winter and the proposed top storey, aside from providing a viewing balcony, will provide much needed meeting

rooms, freeing the Village Hall for bookings which need the space.

Mention of youth brings me to the vandalism problem we have on Watermead. I am sorry to say that I have received reliable reports that a number of Watermead youths were involved in an arson attack on one of our neighbouring farms. If you see people where they shouldn't be, or causing criminal damage, please let the police and the Board know. The Board have a duty to protect Lakeside Land's assets and we will act firmly where necessary, as we did over the unlawful use of a jet-ski on the Lower Lake earlier this year (I am sorry to report that the Crown Prosecution Service have dropped affray charges, in an incident where a weapon was used, for reasons which they have not had the courtesy to explain to me). I am grateful to the resident who reported an attempted break-in to the Village Hall and stopped it.

Lakeside Land maintains good relations with most landlords on Watermead and will report tenants who have broken the law. In cases such as assault and bullying of younger children by youths, theft of bicycles and motor vehicle interference, all of which have been reported to me, there may well be a breach of the tenancy agreement or of the estate covenants which bind every property on Watermead. I will not condone such unlawful behaviour and will support any landlord who acts responsibly and within the law to put out tenants who make life miserable for their neighbours and have only a casual regard for their legal obligations.

I am please to report progress in getting our legal agreements with Captain's Cabin in place. This opens the way to much fuller co-operation between them and the community. Chris Floyd has done a good job over there and I urge you all to support him. You will certainly see me hiring his rowing boats come the summer! I recommend the annual hire of £50, which I consider to be good value for money. We have given firm support to WM Newsagents in their application for a sub Post Office, which we badly need. Please

Quite apart from the cost of petrol at £3 a gallon (and cars drink petrol on short runs, particularly if the engines are cold) there is the damage to the environment, particularly from modern cars with catalytic converters, which are all but inoperative on short journeys. I don't have enough hair to provide Avanti with lots of business but I am sure there are lots of you who o - why go elsewhere? If you need some fencing or contracting work done why not give James Campion a call on 614785? I have sought since becoming Chairman to improve the relations between businesses on Watermead and the community. Where business ventures threatened the community, such as the night-club, we have opposed them, but on the other side of the coin businesses which support the community deserve our support in return.

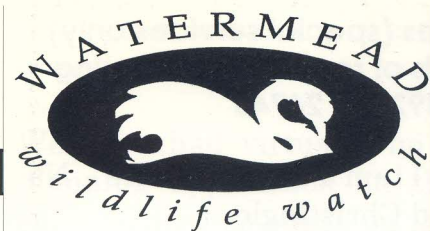

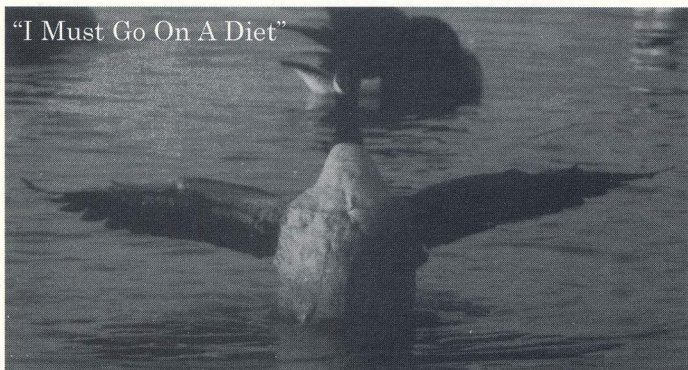

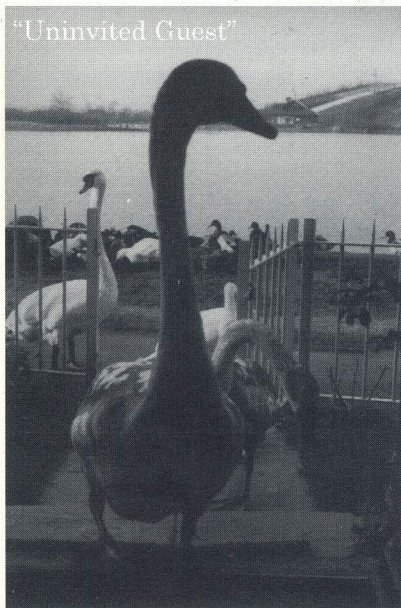
# Wildlife Watch

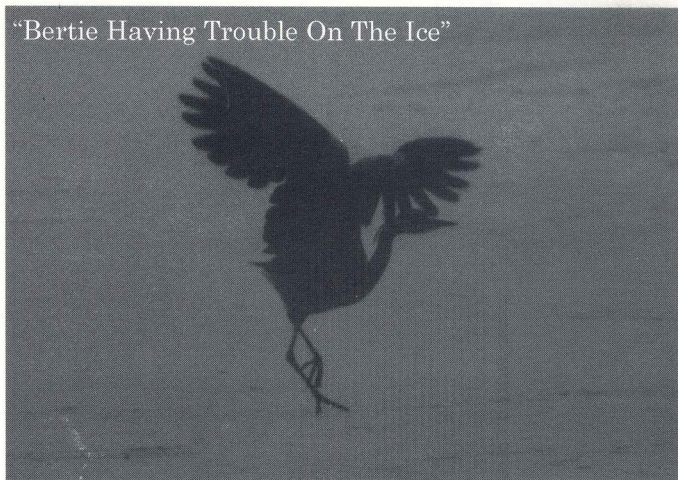
habits of the resident birds, and Watermead residents are fiercely protective of 'Our Swans', 'Our Ducks', etc., good news for everyone!

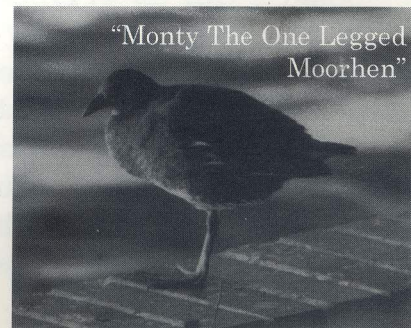

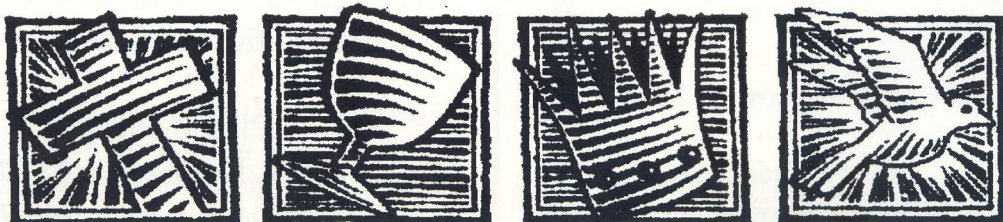

# Watermead Neighbourhood Watch

## NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH UPDATE

There has been great concern expressed by the police regarding the theft and burglary offences. People are not safeguarding their property by closing either the car or house doors and ensuring that they have been securely locked.

**Remember** as the Christmas season is now upon us give a thought to the thief and do not let him do his Christmas shopping in your home.

**Extremely important** now is the time to be aware of bogus callers. There have already been several incidents of bogus Waterboard and Council officials in the Aylesbury area and this is the time of the year when they are at their busiest.

**Do not let anyone into your home without production of a valid identity card carrying the officials photograph. If in doubt ring~ the appropriate authority to confirm the validity.**

One last point give a little thought to your elderly neighbours over the winter months and ensure that everything is OK.

Have a Merry Christmas & a Happy New Year

1. When leaving your home lock all external doors and windows.
2. When retiring at night secure all external doors and windows, making sure there is a quick and easy route out of the building in case of emergency.
3. Where possible fit and use a door chain and viewer to check and verify the identification of all callers at the door.
4. Dark unlit houses are an invitation to burglars, illuminate them, by using timer switches inside and security lighting outside.
5. Don't help the burglar----Tools, Ladders, and Garden furniture should be locked away or secured in such a manner so they cannot be used by the thief to gain entry to your home.
6. Deter the burglar by marking your property with your postcode and house number. The best method is by engraving or etching, if this is not possible use an ultra violet ( invisible ) marking pen.
7. A picture is worth a thousand words, photograph items that may be devalued or are impossible to mark i.e. jewellery. Include items that have a sentimental or high value. Police can now transfer pictures into a computer system which covers the whole of London . Officers can check property they recover, against the pictures held in the computer
8. As the festive season is upon us there is often more cash kept in the house to meet those additional bills. Don't keep more cash in the house than is really needed, use cheques, cheque cards or credit type cards whenever possible to make those purchases.
9. Don't let burglars do their Christmas shopping from your house or vehicle, keep presents hidden away from view.
10. If you have an alarm fitted to your property, remember hanging decorations can be the cause of false alarms. Always check where decorations are placed.
11. If you are going away for Christmas ask a friend or neighbour to check your property regularly. Ask them to clear the mail, check doors, windows timers, and open and close the curtains. If you are a member of a Neighbourhood Watch always inform your neighbour, co-ordinator and advise the local police station of who will be calling at the house when you are away.
12. Always report any incident or suspicion to the Police. If it is an emergency use '999'
