2. To agree the accounts to end March 2019 - The Clerk had previously circulated the Accounts to end March 2019, which were approved.

19.29 Councillors' Reports and Recommendations

1 Update on Routine Land Work Wire Fence between the Lakes

Cllrs discussed the wire fence between the two lakes, which had been installed by the EA under the instruction of the PC at the request of the Piscatorials. It was felt that this was now potentially harmful to wildlife when water levels were low and distressing to see wildlife struggling to get through. It was proposed and unanimously agreed to instruct EA to remove the wire fence.

The Clerk

The ROSPA inspection had taken place and the report forwarded to contractors and landowners.

There was an issue with cars parking in the drop kerb section by the large lake and it was agreed to source a template to spray "No Parking".

** AWAITING INSTALLATION** Accepted Quotation (Qty. 50) from Dave Lucas for Walkway

Dave Lucas has now been in contact with the manufacture of the proposed brackets for the Watermead Walkway and has advised as follows:

"I have looked into the possibility of phasing this work but in my view it would be prohibitively expensive as the retooling is £125 per batch for manufacture. I do appropriate this is a fairly large investment and whilst I would be willing to purchase the brackets in bulk I would prefer not to as I simply would be hard pushed to do so. I have revisited my pricing as if it would be several visits. I have spent a reasonable amount of time with both fabricators in order to get the prototype produced this I have not and will not charge for."

Dave confirmed the prices are as follows. Dave also advised that he believes to install all 50 at once will take more than a day but is willing to only charge one day's labour. Original quotation of £935.00 includes fixings – This would need to be added to all of the above.

Outdoor Gym Project

Update June 2019 – Sport England Grant Application - The programme had proved extremely popular, with a high number of strong ideas being submitted from organisations across the country. With demand being so high, regretfully this means they are not able to support as many projects as we would like to. Unfortunately, after careful consideration by the panel, they have not been able to support our project on this occasion. Will continue to seek grants.

Replacement Dog Waste Bin

Marcus Young advised he would send the dog waste bin and for our contractor to install.

A follow up email has been sent to Marcus Young Landscapes. To date no response has been received.

River Thame Trust Update

Update report received February 2019: Before moving forward with suggestions for improvement works on the river at Watermead I think it is key that we first establish the water depth at low flows. If the water is shallow we could think about running a work party to add in some woody material to the channel to increase the habitat and flow diversity. However if water is going to be above thigh high we wouldn't be able to do this safely with volunteers. I'll plan to visit later in the year to

establish the depth and then we can move forward from there.

Watermead Junction

Monday 17th June three Watermead volunteers started the works at the "Welcome to Watermead" sign. It certainly is noticeable when you drive in. Thank you to Dave Lucas too for lending the strimmer/equipment. They have done an amazing job.





CCTV Update – Cllr Toler reported on CCTV camera activity and it was agreed that the Clerk should make contact with Jean at Comptons regarding the possibility of installing cameras in the car park. If approved "CCTV operates in this area" signage to be installed.

Outdoor Yoga Land Request – A request has been received from a Judita Kotelesova to operate outdoor yoga on the meadow, a copy of our land use policy has been sent.

The requested dates are 6th and 20th July, which are Saturday mornings 11-12 am.

Judita expects 15-25 people to attend. The events will not happen if it rains. Users will be requested to park at the Piazza. These will be donation-based classes, to teach people a basic short sequence to practice at home and become more resilient to stress.

Copies of insurance policy, yoga teaching certificates and a risk assessment has been received, I will send via separate email.

Cllrs unanimously approved the request for the two mornings.

2 To discuss provision of Meadow BBQ



"The unit is self-supporting and is placed directly on the grass. People use the BBQ area and then slide the hot remains into the slot, which is self-closing, and they drop into a steel lined casing which is emptied via a locked section at the side.

The cost is £1,250 plus delivery or alternatively the unit can be rented from David Ogilvie for the summer at a cost of £26 per week for 26 weeks. At the end of this period they collect it, clean and renovate as necessary and it can be re-delivered for next year. Apparently Littlehampton council has done this for 7 years and has now bought one. We frequently say that people are having BBQ and they ruin the grass and this seems a brilliant and safe solution".

It was agreed to rent one on a trial basis. Signage to be temporarily covered to allow BBQ's to take place on this unit only.

3 To report on BBOWT & Vale Countryside Volunteers Land Requests

Cllr Rose, the Clerk and Mark Militello along with the Chiltern Rangers had identified 4 areas to cut back. It was proposed and agreed to allow Pebblebrook School to assist in tidying up area number 1 in the Woodland area and plant wildflowers. Work to continue with Vale Volunteers. Seeding to begin around the gatehouse on 5 October. Date to be included in the Autumn edition of the Village View for volunteers to attend.
